Direction for Use:

- Crop / Pest: For post harvest application to apples and pears for control of *Penicillium expansum* (blue mold)
- Application rate: 0.125 oz per US ton (3 grams per 900 kilograms)
- Application method: Thermal fogging
- Frequency / Timing: Apply only once to the dry fruit as received from the field after harvest prior to long term storage.

Fumigating applicators must wear:

- Full-face respirator with organic vapor filter
- Long-sleeved shirt and long pants
- Chemical-resistant gloves made of any waterproof material such as polyvinyl chloride, nitrile rubber or butyl rubber
- Shoes and socks

Application Rate

0.125oz per US ton (3-g per 900-Kg) of fruit

Preparation for Decco Salt No. 19 Treatment**1-In combination with DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL**

- Following the label direction of DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL melt the DPA using an appropriate container. Cover and place the container on an electrical heater and melt the DPA at 180°F
- Calculate the amount of Decco Salt No.19 according to the application rate.
- Weigh the amount of Decco Salt No. 19 to the nearest gram into a clean and dry container.
- Add the Decco Salt No. 19 slowly and under gentle mixing to the molten DPA

2-In combination with DECCOSOL 408 (adjuvant)

- Calculate the amount of Decco Salt No. 19 according to the application rate.
- For each ounce of Decco Salt No. 19 pour two ounces of DECCOSOL 408 (adjuvant) into an appropriate container and heat to 160°F .
- Weigh the amount of Decco Salt No. 19 to the nearest gram into a clean and dry container.
- Add the Decco Salt No. 19 slowly and under gentle mixing to the hot DECCOSOL 408 (adjuvant).

Thermal Fogger Operation

- Place the thermal fogger machine horizontally outside the treatment room at a height of about 3 feet from the floor. Cover the door or window to the treatment room with a plastic sheet and insert the fogging pipe through a hole in the plastic. Seal the opening around the nozzle with duct tape.
- Adjust the pump and mount the nozzle to deliver up to 120 mL per minute.
- Turn on the thermal fogger machine.
- Insert the insulated input pipe into the aerosol mixture. Start the pump. Keep the product temperature at 160-180°F.

Application Procedures

- Avoid breathing the fog
- Turn off room cooling systems and humidifiers 12 hours prior to and during treatment.
- Turn off room circulation fans immediately prior to and during treatment.
- Turn on room circulation fans one hour after the treatment.
- Allow the fog totally to disappear (about 5 hours post-treatment) before restarting cooling systems.
- DO NOT rinse apples after treatment
- Fruit must have shipping carton marked: "Treated with Thiabendazole to retard spoilage."

Restricted Entry Interval (REI)

Entry into the treatment area by another person other than properly trained and equipped handlers is prohibited from the start of application until the treated area is ventilated as follows:

- 8 hours with no ventilation followed by 1 hour of mechanical ventilation
- 24 hours with no ventilation

In case it is necessary to enter the treatment area during treatment or before ventilation requirements have been met, handlers must wear chemical resistant headgear and a self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA, MSHA/NIOSH approval number prefix TC-13F) in addition to PPE listed under the PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENTS (PPE):

Mixers, loaders, applicators, and other handles must wear:

- Long sleeve shirt and long pants.
- Shoes, plus socks.
- Chemical-resistant gloves, and
- A dust mist filtering respirator (MSH / NIOSH approval number prefix TC-21 C), or a NIOSH approved respirator with any N, R, P or HE filter.

USER SAFETY REQUIREMENTS:

Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning / maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables exist, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry.

USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATION:

- Users should wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, tobacco, or using the toilet.
- User should remove clothing / PPE immediately if pesticides get inside. Then wash thoroughly and put on clean clothing.
- Users should remove PPE immediately after handling this product. Wash the outside of gloves before removing. As soon as possible, wash thoroughly and change into clean clothing.

Restrictions / Precaution:

- For use under this SLN label do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.
- When applying this product to pears do not "Decco No Scald DPA Aerosol (EPA Reg. No. 2792-73). Use "Deccosol 408" as a carrier.

WSDA Container Disposal Guidance:

- Completely empty the contents of the pesticide container into application equipment, and apply to a labeled crop or site. The empty container may be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Burning is not a legal method of container disposal in Washington.
