DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Hop / Twospotted Spider Mite: Apply 1 to 5 quarts per 100 gallons of water. Apply by ground equipment only. Thorough coverage is essential. Use 50 to 150 gallons of dilute spray emulsion per acre depending on plant size. Use spray equipment that insures producing a small uniform spray droplet. Make applications as needed up to time of harvest.

RESTRICTIONS / PRECAUTIONS:

- Before using, make certain spray tank is free of sulfur residues. Do not apply sulfur within 30 days of application of an oil spray.
- Avoid application of oil sprays just prior to or during hot weather (95°F), rainy weather or drying winds. Be aware that certain Hop varieties may be more sensitive to injury by oils at temperatures at or above 90°F.
- Do not use propargite (Omite) during, with or following an oil spray.
- For use under this SLN label do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.

WSDA Container Disposal Guidance:

Pesticide containers must be properly cleaned prior to disposal. The best time to clean empty pesticide containers is during mixing and loading, because residue can be difficult to remove after it dries. Triple or Pressure rinse the pesticide container, empty all pesticide rinse water into the spray tank, and apply to a labeled crop or site. Recycling cleaned containers is the best method of container disposal. Information regarding the recycling of empty and cleaned plastic pesticide containers in Washington is available on the internet from WSU at <http://pep.wsu.edu/waste/wd.html> or from WSDA at <http://agr.wa.gov/PestFert/Pesticides/WastePesticide.htm>. Cleaned containers may also be disposed of in a sanitary landfill, if permitted by the county. Burning is not a legal method of container disposal in Washington.
